

Human Rights Violations in Turkey by Numbers: Rule of Law

- European Court of Human Rights indicated that human rights violations have increased 571% during AKP rule.[1]
- Turkey down two places to rank 101st in 113-country rule of law index. [2]
- Turkey score places it at 13 out of 13 countries in the Eastern Europe and Central Asia region.[3]
- Turkey score places it at 35 out of 36 among upper middle income countries.[4]
- Turkey is ranked 68th out of 75 countries in "Order and Security" category.[5]
- Credible allegations of torture emerged in the trial in the central Anatolian town of Kırıkkale, of 64 defendants facing charges of membership of an armed organization (referred to by the Turkish government and courts as FETÖ Fethullahist Terrorist Organization), and attempting to overthrow the government.[6]
