### **PREFACE**

Turkey, which was once touted as a model country, has now become a case study of what can happen to a country that moves away from the rule of law and human rights. The painful cries of people groaning at the face of oppression, cruelty and injustice are rising all over Turkey, and what's worse is that the society in general is blind and deaf to these grievances. While Turkey's once-faulty democratic regime is rapidly evolving into a one-man dictatorship, economic and social indicators show that the country is precipitating into a ditch.

Anyone who does not speak out against corruption, turns away from democratic principles, ignores unlawfulness, remains oblivious to human rights violations, and above all, supports them by either keeping silent or speaking, has an open or secret responsibility in the collapse of the country.

As Advocates of Silenced Turkey (AST), we are determined not to remain silent about this ominous aggravation of Turkey's maladies. We see it as an undeniable duty to reveal the picture with all its nakedness and to warn those responsible. In this context, with the study in your hand, we tried to demonstrate with numbers how the AKP government and its leader Recep Tayyip Erdogan's efforts to cover up corruption and unlawfulness with more corruption and lawlessness brought the country. Furthermore, we wanted to convey the cultural and social genocide carried out against the dissident segments of the society and the suffering of the victims, which we have tried to interpret with dozens of studies so far, once more with numbers. Numbers are bland by nature, yet the numbers in this study have the hue of grief and they represent how heavy the cost of straying from the law can be.

























































































# SINCE THE DECLARATION OF THE STATE OF **EMERGENCY:**

- More than 1,576,000 people were investigated for being members of an armed terrorist organization
- ➤ More than 100,000 people were arrested
- 234,419 passports were revoked
- More than 152,000 civil servants were dismissed after the declaration of the state of emergency (OHAL).
- ▶ **4,500** judges and prosecutors were dismissed. **4,000** of them were arrested.
- ▶ 1,605 prisoners have been reported to have serious diseases and 604 of whom had major health problems making it impossible to stay in prisons. Their right to life is threatened.
- ⇒ 36 people drowned in the waters of Maritsa river and the Aegean sea while trying to escape persecution in their own countries.
- ▶ 144 people have been kidnapped by the state's intelligence forces since 2016, some of them later appeared devastated by grueling tortures. Some are still missing.
- After the state of emergency, more than 800 people expelled with statutory decrees died due to heavy psychological traumas they had to face or due to fatal accidents in their new but harsh workplaces.

- ➢ For the first time in Turkey's history, more than 17,000 women were arrested for political reasons.
- ➤ A total of over 3,000 children under the age of 6 have been locked in prisons with their mothers, most of whom were detained for political reasons. At one point, nearly 900 hundred babies were growing inside the dark wards of Turkey's prisons.
- ▶ 5,728 institutions were closed and more than 40,000 people working in these institutions were dismissed without any rights, compensation.
- A total of 23,427 academics either lost their right to rank or were expelled. Among them, 406 were the signatories of the declaration of peace, 3,041 were discharged from universities that were closed and 7,508 were dismissed from the public academic institutions due to their alleged affiliations with certain political and social groups.
- With the statutory decrees, 1,598 associations, 560 foundations,
  29 unions, 33 television channels, 34 radio channels,
  90 newspapers and magazines were closed.
- With the statutory decrees, the doors of 1,604 high schools, primary and kindergartens, 360 private lessons and study centers, 847 student dormitories and 15 private universities were locked.
- > 985 commercial companies were confiscated with the statutory decrees.
- The amount of usurped or confiscated assets in the form of personal and corporate bank accounts and movable and immovable assets exceeded \$30 billion dollars.

- ▶ 44 journalists were physically attacked.
- ≥ 23 journalists were verbally threatened.
- > 57 journalists were detained for 144 days in total.
- ▶ 6 journalists were beaten in custody.
- ▶ Trustees were appointed to 59 municipalities that the Kurdish opposition party HDP won in the local elections.
- Prisons have become overcrowded due to arbitrary detention and political revenge operations. Despite its total capacity of 233,194 people, the number of detainees and convicts remaining in Turkish prisons as of 31 March 2022 is 314,502. In terms of prison density rate according to population, Turkey ranked first among the Council of Europe member states with about 3,700 prisoners per 1 million people.
- ▶ The government boasts of spending 20 billion TL to build 227 new prisons while counting its big investments.
  126 of these prisons were built after 15 July 2016.
- Only in the last two years, 104 detainees and convicts have lost their lives in prisons.
- > An estimated 1.8 million books were burned or destroyed in 2016.

## DECLINE OF TURKEY

Turkey was ranked 149th between Congo and Rwanda in the Liberal Democracy Index list, in which 179 countries were evaluated as an indication of severe rights violations and unlawfulness.

Turkey was ranked 153rd among 180 countries in the 2021 press freedom index of Reporters Without Borders.

▶ While 1 dollar was approximately 1 TL in 2011, only 6 cents could be bought with 1 lira in 2021. Parallel to the deviation from the rule of law, the value of the country's currency plummeted to one 16th in ten years. Turkey fell 12 places in the world in terms of attractiveness for investments and doing trade and fell to 73rd place in terms of competitiveness.

According to the World Economic Forum's Competitiveness Report, Turkey ranks 95th among 140 countries in the overall quality of education and 103rd in mathematics and science.

Ranking 117th among 139 countries in the Rule of Law Index, Turkey ranks 69th among 134 countries in terms of fighting against corruption.

Turkey was ranked 149th out of 163 countries in the World's Safest Country index prepared by the Institute for Economics and Peace.

According to the Global Crime Index report published in 2021, Turkey ranks 1st in Europe in Organized Crime and 13th in the world
